A regular meeting of the Beach City Council was called to order by Mayor Walter Losinski on November 7, 2016 at 7:00 pm. **Public Works Report:**

PWS Braden reported the over flow issue on the water tower has been corrected. Before the weather turns too cold the North water tower will be drained for the winter. Fire hydrants were flushed last month. The winter landfill hours have gone into effect; 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of the month 10am - 2pm. Equipment has been winterized and is ready for snow removal.

**Auditor Report:**

Nunberg reviewed her written report. Nunberg also mentioned Beach Cable will be updating channels on Thursday, so residents may need to rescan their TV to access new channels.

**Committee Reports:**

No committee reports given.

**Unfinished Business:**

Sheriff Steele was present to discuss changes to the Law Enforcement Service Contract for the Year 2017 which includes; a reduction of hours from 45 per week to 40 per week as requested by City Council, an increase in hourly rate from \$47.00 to \$52.13, and the Sheriff's Department will no longer enforce any violations of City Ordinance relating to animal control. Discussion. Benes moved to approve the Law Enforcement Service Contract for the Year 2017, second by Marman. Motion carried unanimously. The Sheriff's Report for the month of October consisting of 27 calls, 3 written warnings and 1 citation was reviewed.

**New Business:**

Justin Hyndman with Kadrmas, Lee & Jackson presented ND DOT Change Order 2 in the amount of \$2,400 for Phase 1 of the Multi Use Trail Project. Discussion. Marman moved to approve payment of Change Order 2, second by Larson. Discussion. Marman moved to rescind his previous motion, second by Larson. Motion carried unanimously.

Correspondence was read from Chris and Carrie Marman requesting the supply water line from the city main to the curb stop be replaced because it's a lead line. The water line going from the curb stop to the residence has already been replaced. Beach moved to approve the request, second by Benes. Marman abstained. Motion carried.

Correspondence was read from Beach Veterinary Clinic stating effective immediately impounding of animals will no longer be provided. A committee will meet to make a plan of action of how to handle animal's at large, animal complaints, etc.

Correspondence was read from ND Rural Water User's Association regarding the annual convention December 7-8, 2016 in Bismarck.

An Application for Property Tax Exemption for New Home Construction at 725 5<sup>th</sup> Ave NW was reviewed. Marman moved to approve the application for tax exemption, second by Benes. Motion carried unanimously.

No other business was brought forward. Marman moved to adjourn, second by Walworth. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
